Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation and will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within our community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

This plan sets out how we intend to deal with your priorities. You identified that the priorities for the East Neuk and Landward areas were:

1. Driver Behaviour

You told us about your concerns about speeding vehicles in particular around school areas.

2. Youth Disorder and Antisocial Behaviour

You told us about your concerns surrounding alcohol related anti social behaviour and underage drinking.

3. Rural Thefts

You told us about your concerns about thefts from rural properties.

We have acted on your concerns and are sure that you will have seen an improvement in the East Neuk & Landward area.

Our actions to date.

Promoted Community Engagement

We have a dedicated Community Policing Team that patrol your area and listen to your concerns. Community engagement continues and local officers regularly attend local meetings to enable you to voice your concerns.

Detected Speeding Motorists

We have undertaken regular speed deployments near to our local schools resulting in fixed penalty tickets being issued and reports being submitted where appropriate. In conjunction with Roads Policing we have conducted intelligence led local patrols focusing on habitual offenders.

Sought Sustainable Solutions

In conjunction with partner agencies we have arranged for various speed surveys to be conducted in an effort to provide a long term solution to the issues of speeding within the local area.

Prevented Antisocial Behaviour

We have identified those repeat offenders in the local area and concentrated patrols in the area which has had a positive impact. We have whilst working with partner agencies addressed repeat noise offenders and whilst utilising the Area Safer Communities Group these offenders have been dealt with robustly.

Provided Community Reassurance

We regularly deploy officers under the Campaign Against Violence initiative in your area, targeting areas where anti-social behaviour has become a concern.

Deterred Rural Thefts

We have carried out intelligence led stop points in your area to disrupt travelling criminals intent on committing theft within the area. Using local and additional police resources, we have carried out operations within the area focusing on theft of scrap metal, theft from rural properties and we have achieved a decrease in this area.



In the coming months.

Promote Community Engagement

We will continue to address your identified concerns through Community Engagement with the East Neuk area. We will maintain the good links we currently enjoy with local elected members in order to both share information and identify issues that may cause concern to the East Neuk & Landward communities.

Detect Speeding Motorists

Officers will continue to undertake regular speed checks in the local areas paying particular attention to the roads surrounding our schools. We will continue to work with our partner agencies to provide long term solutions to speeding issues within the East Neuk and Landward area. Officers will continue to target repeat offenders and deal with them in a robust manner ensuring that they are accountable for any offences committed by them.

Prevent Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to engage with our local schools and the young people who attend them regarding the effect of anti-social behaviour. We will continue through use of intelligence led patrols to target known areas of concern within the local community. We will assist all partner agencies including housing associations involved in reducing anti-social behaviour and will support the use of ASBO legislation where appropriate ensuring that we enforce same robustly.

Provide Community Reassurance

We will continue to utilise officers through the Campaign Against Violence initiative to target areas of concern and provide a reassuring presence within the local community.

Deter Rural Thefts

We will continue to utilise all additional police and partner agencies to actively target any known persons involved in theft from rural premises or involved in the theft of scrap from your area.

Work in Partnership

Your dedicated local Community Policing Officers will continue to work with all local partners and will patrol East Neuk & Landward area listening to and addressing your concerns.
