Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan update will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation and will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within our community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

This update sets out how we intend to deal with your priorities. You identified that the priorities for the East Neuk & Landward area were:

1. Driver Behaviour

You told us your concerns about speeding vehicles in particular around school areas.

2. Youth Disorder and Antisocial Behaviour

You told us your concerns regarding alcohol related antisocial behaviour and under-age drinking.

3. Rural Thefts

You told us your concerns about thefts from rural properties.

We have acted on your concerns and are sure you will have seen improvements in the East Neuk & Landward area.

Our actions carried out to date.

Driver Behaviour

Your Community Policing Team employs an intelligence led approach to driver behaviour. We build on successes achieved in detecting offenders and continue to address the issue through legislative enforcement and driver education.

Youth Disorder and Antisocial Behaviour

Working with licensing colleagues we have reinforced the need for responsible practices within the licensing industry. Regular deployments of Campaign Against Violence and community officers have helped reduced antisocial behaviour.

Rural Thefts

We have implemented disruption tactics in an effort to prevent thefts and target those responsible and this has resulted in a number of high profile individuals being detected and reported for offences within East Neuk and Landward.

In addition to this, you can expect to see a number of other things happening in the next few weeks and months:

We will maintain efforts to address the concerns raised by the East Neuk & Landward community through continued public consultation and interaction with elected members and partner agencies.

Community policing officers will continue to engage with pupils and staff at all local schools in order to assist in the development of community values.

Each area within the East Neuk & Landward ward will continue to have dedicated community police officers who have a good knowledge of the area and its particular needs. These officers will identify issues and emerging trends and work with the Community Policing Team and our response policing colleagues to address these problems as they arise.
