Community Policing Plan Update 2016

Our focus. Your priorities.

Glasgow South West Local Problem Solving Team

This Multi Member Ward Plan update will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation and will inform you of the progress we have made in the first half of the year. It will also highlight further steps we plan to take throughout the rest of this year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within our community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners to find effective long-term solutions to the issues you have raised.

Local Priorities

This update sets out how we intend to deal with your priorities. You identified that the priorities for the Greater Pollok area were:

1. Violent Crime and Antisocial Behaviour

You told us that violent crime, youth disorder and antisocial behaviour were occurring within your community.

2. Drug Dealing and Drug Misuse

You told us that drug dealing and drug misuse was of concern.

3. Dishonesty

You told us of your concerns about housebreakings and other forms of theft, including thefts from motor vehicles.

4. Road Safety and Road Crime

You told us of your concerns about road safety and road crime.

We have acted on your concerns and we are sure you will have seen some improvements in the Greater Pollok area.

Our actions carried out to date.

Violent Crime and Antisocial Behaviour

Working alongside Community Safety Glasgow and local housing associations, we have directed our resources to identified areas, in an effort to reduce antisocial behaviour. We continue to target those involved in crimes of domestic abuse

Drug Dealing and Drug Misuse

Building upon information provided locally, community officers along with national specialists have executed search warrants at addresses where drug dealing has taken place. This has resulted in several large drug seizures in the area.

Dishonesty

We have directed dedicated patrols to tackle crimes of dishonesty, in particular vehicle crime, and have arrested several individuals resulting in a number of high value vehicles being recovered.

Road Safety and Road Crime

Targeting areas identified by the community, we have sought to identify and deter offenders utilising local officers, specialist road policing officers and partner agencies. Together we have targeted speeding offences and drink drivers to improve road safety.

In addition to this, you can expect to see a number of other things happening in the next few weeks and months:

Violent Crime and Antisocial Behaviour

Working with partner agencies we will endeavour to identify those responsible for antisocial behaviour and tackle the issue through education, enforcement and diversionary tactics.

Drug Dealing and Drug Misuse

Using information from the community, we will continue to identify and tackle those involved in the supply of controlled drugs whilst directing those suspected of abusing substances to support agencies.

Dishonesty

By issuing crime prevention advice to the community and by targeting those responsible for crimes of dishonesty, we aim to reduce the volume of acquisitive crimes happening.

Road Safety and Road Crime

We will continue to tackle road safety at identified collision 'hot spots' and support Glasgow City Council in relation to issues in and around local schools.
