Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan update highlights priorities that your community identified for us to focus on this year. It has been produced to update you on our progress.

Our focus has been on reducing crime and disorder, increasing public reassurance and keeping people safe in all of our communities.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities and it includes our future plans. Your priorities for the Clackmannanshire East area were:

1. Antisocial Behaviour

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour and underage drinking.

2. Vandalism

You are concerned about vandalism particularly at schools.

3. Alcohol and drugs

You are concerned about alcohol misuse and drug dealing.

4. Community Engagement & Reassurance

You told us it was important to have community officers, who are accessible and who are able to address local problems.



Our actions to date

- We have published a weekly intelligence led ASB document to ensure that patrols are directed in the right place at the right times and current issues are highlighted and addressed.
 - We have dedicated community police officers to patrol your area and listen to your concerns. These officers are deployed in uniform and plain clothes and carry out proactive patrols and provide reassurance. We also use our twitter feed to update you with appeals, news and information about local policing in Clackmannanshire East.
 - We have shared the information with Community Wardens and have carried out joint patrols in the areas ensuring ASB calls are kept to a minimum and sent out letters to parents in relation to their child being spoken to by the Police or Community Wardens.
 - We have carried out visits and offered crime prevention advice to victims of vandalism in our communities.
 - Community Traffic Wardens have been in our communities assisting with enquiries and ensuring that nearby residents are aware of recent crimes in order to prevent repeat incidents.
 - We have carried out driver awareness patrols and speed enforcement campaigns in our communities.

In the coming months.

- We will work closely with local schools and communities in order to engage with young people regarding antisocial behaviour.
 - We will continue to provide dedicated antisocial behaviour patrols that will target locations identified by you as being a problem.
 - We will target our speeding patrols on the A91 through Dollar and Muckhart.
 - We will liaise with Clackmannanshire Roads Department to monitor locations where parking has been highlighted as a problem.
 - We will work with Clackmannanshire Council and Housing Associations to target those who persistently behave in an antisocial manner, supporting the use of ASBOs and share information to assist in tackling problem tenants.
 - We will continue to engage with youths on BMX Bikes and Skateboards in an effort to reduce the impact on local residents.
 - We will target those who supply alcohol to young people. We will take robust action against licensed premises who break the law including the use of test purchase and reporting to Clackmannanshire Licensing Board.
 - We will ensure that our community officers are available in your community in order that you can inform them of problems.
 - We will keep you informed as to what we are doing to make your community safer.
