Multi Member Ward Plan 2014

Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation and will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, keep people safe and respond effectively to local concerns. We will work with partners to achieve this.

Your priorities for 2013 were Antisocial Behaviour, Vandalism, Road Safety and Community Engagement. What we did to address them is shown in our actions to date.

Some of these are still priorities for 2014 and our plans in the coming months for this year's priorities are highlighted later.

Local Priorities

This plan sets out how we intend to deal with your priorities. You identified that the priorities for the Clackmannanshire East area were:

1. Drugs

You told us your concerns about drug dealing and drug abuse.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

You highlighted issues regarding youths causing annoyance associated with rowdy drunken behaviour.

3. Road Safety

You told us about speeding motorists and persons parking dangerously who pose a danger on your roads.

4. Housebreaking

You expressed concern about your home being broken into and the impact upon you and your family.

We have acted on your concerns and are sure you will have seen improvements in the Clackmannanshire East area.

Our actions to date.

Antisocial Behaviour

Through links established with partners we identified residents affected by antisocial behaviour and provided a multi-agency response to support victims and deal with offenders.

Drugs misuse affects communities, and community intelligence helped us to tackle drug dealing. We also worked with partners to find longer term solutions to this issue.

We targeted antisocial behaviour through dedicated patrols at locations and times identified by local people that young people gather, behave in a rowdy manner and damage property. We focused on preventing young people from obtaining alcohol and targeted those who supplied alcohol to them.

Police and Community Wardens shared information and carried out joint patrols in problem areas ensuring ASB calls are kept to a minimum.

We visited on-sales and off-sales licensed premises to ensure they adhered to the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, and enforced public drinking byelaws in your area.

Vandalism

We have engaged with our partner agencies and schools in efforts to reduce the level of vandalism. We have carried out visits and offered crime prevention advice to victims of vandalism in our communities.

Road Safety

We focused activity at locations where speeding was identified by local people as being a concern and liaised with Clackmannanshire Council Roads Department to monitor other potential problem areas for speeding and parking. We enforced seat belt and mobile phone legislation to make our roads safer.

Community Engagement

Community police officers made every effort to attend your community meetings to listen to your concerns and to keep you updated about current issues in your community

They also patrolled the communities of Dollar, Muckhart, Forestmill and Clackmannan to learn about and address local problems.

We used our twitter feed to update you with appeals, news and information about local policing.

In the coming months.

Drugs

We will take action against those who might be dealing drugs in the Dollar, Muckhart, Forestmill and Clackmannan areas in order to disrupt their criminal activity. We will seek help from the community by asking them to provide information about such activity.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to provide dedicated antisocial behaviour patrols that will target locations identified by you as being a problem.

Working with Clackmannanshire Council and Housing Associations we will focus on those who persistently behave in an antisocial manner, supporting the use of Antisocial Behaviour Orders and sharing information to assist in tackling problem tenants.

We will continue to target those who supply alcohol to young people. We will take robust action against licensed premises which break the law including the use of test purchase and reporting to Clackmannanshire Licensing Board.

Road Safety

We will continue to target speeding motorists at locations identified by local people as being a problem and we will monitor areas where dangerous/illegal parking is reported.

We will work in partnership with Clackmannanshire Council to ensure the road network throughout your area is as safe as possible.

Housebreaking

Our proactive approach to tackling housebreakings will continue. By being visible in identified areas, engaging with offenders and disrupting their activities we will seek to reduce the incidence of this crime.

Working with partners, local business and communities we will support crime reduction initiatives, and update you about recent incidents and how we responded.

When required, we will seek the assistance of specialist support from across the country in our efforts to keep your home safe.

Community Engagement

We know that communities want visible, recognisable and accessible community officers and our community policing model will provide that.
