Multi Member Ward Plan Update 2014

## Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation and will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within our community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

### Local Priorities

This update sets out how we intend to deal with your priorities. You identified that the priorities for the Forth and Endrick area were:

#### 1. Antisocial Behaviour

You told us about antisocial behaviour including vandalism and under-age drinking, mainly in the summer.

#### 2. Road safety

You spoke about vehicles speeding, in particular through rural villages, and dangerous parking at schools.

#### 3. Housebreaking and other thefts

You told us your concerns about housebreaking and other thefts.

#### 4. Community Policing

You want community teams who are accessible and can address local problems.

We have acted on your concerns and are sure you will have seen improvements in the Forth and Endrick area.

# Our actions carried out to date.

## **Antisocial behaviour**

Working with partners, we patrolled problem locations you identified. Those engaged in anti-social behaviour were reported to the Procurator Fiscal.

## **Road safety**

Speeding and irresponsible drivers were targeted in your villages and on the trunk road network. Uninsured cars were seized and those driving while drunk arrested.

## **Housebreaking and theft**

Operation Shortfin featured local officers assisted by staff from across the Forth Valley area and specialist officers to carry out road checks to identify and disrupt traveling criminals. All thefts and housebreakings are thoroughly investigated. A national property marking initiative was launched locally and is in place as a crime prevention measure.

## **Community Engagement**

Your community policing team have been in your communities, available for advice and to deal with your concerns.

**In addition to this, you can expect to see a number of other things happening in the next few weeks and months:**

## **Antisocial behaviour**

Problem locations you identify will be robustly patrolled and offenders reported. We will work with local authority licencing officers and licenced premises to tackle drunken behaviour.

## **Road safety**

We will continue to focus on the irresponsible use of vehicles with a visible presence on the roads, supporting national priorities to keep road users safe.

## **Housebreaking and theft**

Intelligence led Policing and high visibility day and night time patrols will continue to disrupt and deter travelling criminals in liaison with neighbouring divisions. All possible lines of enquiry will be rigorously pursued.

## **Community Engagement**

We will report regularly to community councils and elected members on policing in your areas. You can contact your community team and arrange to speak to a local officer at a time to suit you.
