Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan update will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation and will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within our community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

This update sets out how we intend to deal with your priorities. You identified that the priorities for the Clackmannanshire East area were:

1. Drug Dealing and Misuse

You told us that drug dealing and drug misuse was of concern and affecting your quality of life.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

You highlighted issues about people, in particular young people, obtaining alcohol and engaging in antisocial behaviour, carrying out acts of vandalism and disorder.

3. Road Safety

You told us about speeding motorists and persons parking dangerously who pose a danger on your roads.

4. Violent Crime

You told us your concerns regarding the level of assaults and associated violent crimes that occur within your area

We have acted on your concerns and are sure you will have seen improvements in the Clackmannanshire East area.



Our actions to date.

Drug dealing and Misuse

We have executed search warrants and made arrests relating to drug dealing following information from the community.

We have completed searches of persons suspected to be in possession of controlled drugs.

Antisocial Behaviour

We have carried out joint patrols with Community Wardens in Clackmannanshire East to tackle antisocial behaviour.

We have deployed additional officers in Clackmannanshire East to keep our streets safe.

We have visited problem addresses with partners to ensure that disruptive behaviour is challenged.

Road Safety

We have made our roads safer by targeting speeding motorists and enforcing seat belt and mobile phone legislation.

We have completed Operations with our partners to ensure vehicles are roadworthy.

Violent Crime

We have disrupted the activities of offenders by carrying out additional patrols within identified areas.

We support local crime reduction initiatives by working with partners and local businesses.

We have sought bail conditions to prevent victims suffering a reoccurrence of the crime and actively policed these.



In the coming months.

In addition to this, you can expect to see a number of other things happening in the next few weeks and months:

Drug Dealing and Misuse

We will seek help from the community by asking you to provide information about drug dealing.

We will continue to target individuals involved in drugs supply in Clackmannan, Forestmill, Dollar and Muckhart.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to patrol identified areas to reduce antisocial behaviour.

We will target those who supply alcohol to young people.

We will work closely with local schools to engage with young people regarding the misuse of alcohol and drugs and the impact of antisocial behaviour on our community.

Road Safety

We will continue to make our roads safer through speed enforcement campaigns.

We will work with Clackmannanshire Council to ensure the road network is as safe as possible.

Violent Crime

We will continue to support local crime initiatives by working with partners and local businesses.

We will continue to target offenders as a priority and continue patrols within identified areas to disrupt such crime.
