Multi Member Ward Plan 2015

Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation. It will inform you of the action we have taken up till now to address those priorities and how we plan to continue to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

You identified that the policing priorities for the Forth and Endrick area are as follows:

1. Road Safety

You told us speeding motorists and other forms of antisocial driving were causing issues. You are concerned about road safety in and around villages, local and trunk roads.

2. Housebreaking and Theft

You told us of your concerns about housebreakings and other forms of theft, including theft from motor vehicles, thefts of machinery, tools, bicycles and fuel.

3. Antisocial Behaviour

You told us that you had concerns about antisocial behaviour in the area, particularly persons littering or fly-tipping. You were concerned about the impact this was having on the Forth and Endrick communities.

4. Drug Dealing and Misuse

You told us there were problems with drug misuse and associated antisocial behaviour and how this is affecting your quality of life.

We have listened to your concerns and are working hard to make improvements in the Forth and Endrick area.

Our actions to date.

Road Safety

We have shared your concerns relating to speeding motorists with specialist colleagues to allow them to target enforcement activity in the area. Specific operations, such as Operation Westlock frequently take place to tackle road safety issues.

Housebreaking and Theft

We have carried out through the day and night patrols and Operations in an effort to deter and detect those responsible for crimes of dishonesty. We have maximised all forensic opportunities, using specialist technicians to gather evidence from crime scenes. We have utilised dedicated enquiry teams to investigate all instances of housebreaking to identify patterns and target suspects.

Antisocial Behaviour

We have liaised closely with Stirling Council regarding instances of littering and fly-tipping and have dealt with offenders by issuing fixed penalty notices or report to the Procurator Fiscal where appropriate. We have patrolled local hot spots where littering has been an issue and engaged with persons to prevent further incidents.

Partnership working

Where repeated antisocial behaviour has occurred at particular addresses, we have shared information and worked with our partners at Stirling Council to identify long term solutions to the problem.

Drug dealing and Abuse

Through intelligence-led policing we targeted suspected drug dealers in the area and obtained search warrants for their houses. We focused on drug misuse through the use of stop and search powers and reported offenders.



In the coming months.

Road Safety

We will continue to work with our colleagues from specialist departments to carry out enforcement activity relating to speeding motorists. Community police officers will patrol in prominent locations and carry out periodic road checks to positively influence driver behaviour.

Housebreaking and Theft

We will continue to patrol at key times to deter and detect those responsible for crimes of dishonesty. We will continue to offer crime prevention and security advice to improve security at vulnerable premises. We will develop community intelligence and where suspects are identified, will target them and prioritise their arrest.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to retain close links with Stirling Council and advise them of instances of littering and fly-tipping and when offenders are traced, we will deal with them accordingly. Our Officers will continue to patrol and engage with persons to prevent further issues.

Drug dealing and Misuse

We will remain visible in the community to develop intelligence on people who deal in and use controlled drugs. We will target drug dealers to reduce availability of drugs and will continue to work with our partners, combining education and enforcement strategies.

Partnership Working

We will continue to use our links with all local partners, including Stirling Council, to share information and identify long term solutions to recurring problems in the ward and surrounding area.

Community Policing

We know that communities want visible, recognisable and accessible community officers and our community policing model will provide that.
