## Multi Member Ward Plan 2013

This policing plan outlines the priorities you identified during our consultations in 2012. We will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and make people feel safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners to find effective long term solutions to issues you have raised.

### Local Priorities

You identified the following priorities:

#### 1. Antisocial Behaviour

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including underage drinking.

#### 2. Vandalism

You are concerned about vandalism particularly at schools.

#### 3. Roads

You are concerned about speeding and inconsiderate and illegal parking.

#### 4. Community Engagement and Reassurance

You told us it was important to have community officers who you know, who are accessible and who address local problems.

# Actions carried out to date

- We have targeted antisocial behaviour through dedicated patrols at locations identified by local people as being a problem.
- We have charged people for a number of antisocial behaviour offences including public drinking and breach of the peace.
- We have visited on-sales and off-sales licensed premises to ensure they are adhering to Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.
- We have visited repeat complainers in an effort to reassure them and solve their problems.
- We have engaged with our partner agencies and schools in efforts to reduce the level of vandalism.
- We have carried out handheld radar checks in areas where speeding was identified as a problem.
- We have engaged with local schools and Clackmannanshire roads department in efforts to resolve parking issues near your schools.
- We have engaged with young people on the streets using BMX bikes and skateboards and have educated them in the safe and considerate use of them.
- Your community police officers patrol the communities of Clackmannan, Forestmill, Dollar and Muckhart area and will listen and address your concerns.

# In the Coming Months

- We will work closely with local schools and communities in order to engage with young people regarding antisocial behaviour.
- We will continue to provide dedicated antisocial behaviour patrols that will target locations identified by you as being a problem.
- We will target our speeding patrols at locations identified by local people as being a problem.
- We will liaise with Clackmannanshire Roads Department to monitor locations where parking has been highlighted as a problem.
- We will work with Clackmannanshire Council and Housing Associations to target those who persistently behave in an antisocial manner, supporting the use of ASBOs and share information to assist in tackling problem tenants.
- We will continue to engage with youths on BMX Bikes and Skateboards in an effort to reduce the impact on local residents.
- We will target those who supply alcohol to young people. We will take robust action against licensed premises who break the law including the use of test purchase and reporting to Clackmannanshire Licensing Board.
- We will ensure that our community officers are available in your community in order that you can inform them of problems.
- We will keep you informed as to what we are doing to make your community safer.
