# Dunblane & Bridge of Allan

## Multi Member Ward Plan 2013

This policing plan outlines the priorities you identified during our consultations in 2012. We will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and make people feel safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners to find effective long term solutions to issues you have raised.

### Local Priorities

You identified that the following priorities:

#### 1. Antisocial Behaviour

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including vandalism and underage drinking.

#### 2. Road Safety

Your are concerned about speeding and inconsiderate parking near schools

#### 3. Housebreaking/Theft

You are concerned about housebreaking and thefts.

#### 4. Community Engagement and Reassurance

You said it was important to have community officers who you know, who are accessible and who address local problems.

# Actions carried out to date

- We have targeted antisocial behaviour through dedicated patrols at locations identified by local people as being a problem.
- We have issued Fixed Penalty Notices and charged / reported a number of people for antisocial behaviour offences including public drinking, vandalism and breach of the peace.
- We have targeted licensed premises to ensure license holders and staff are acting responsibly in their supply and sale of alcohol which has had a positive impact on licensing related offences.
- We have engaged with partners to resolve youth associated issues when they have been identified.
- We have used speed detecting equipment close to schools and other problematic locations leading to a number of people identified for speeding and other road traffic offences.
- We have visited schools and identified vehicles that are parked illegally and warned the owners to improve the parking issues.
- We have carried out proactive stop checks at areas where travelling criminals may be using the road infrastructure to target our area which has reduced acquisitive crime.
- We have increased our engagement with you by introducing regular surgeries within our communities.
- Your community police officers patrol the Dunblane, Bridge of Allan and Stirling University areas listening to you and responding to your concerns.

# In the Coming Months

- We will work closely with local schools in order to engage with young people regarding antisocial behaviour and providing them with crime prevention advice.
- We are introducing a schools based officer at Wallace High School who will identify young people experiencing difficulties, offending or at risk of offending in the community and be an active participant in the multi-agency support of those persons.
- We will target those who supply alcohol to young people. We will take robust action against licensed premises who break the law including the use of test purchase and reporting to Stirling Licensing Board.
- We will work with Stirling Council and Housing Associations to target those who persistently behave in an antisocial manner, supporting the use of ASBOs and share information to assist in tackling problem tenants.
- We will continue to provide dedicated antisocial behaviour patrols that will target locations identified by you as being a problem.
- We will continue to use speed-detecting equipment, marked and unmarked police vehicles to detect speeding and other road traffic offences.
- We will continue with our intelligence led targeted patrols, using marked and unmarked police vehicle and new technology in order to deter housebreakings and other types of theft.
- We will ensure that our community officers are available in your community in order that you can inform them of problems. This will include high visibility foot patrol within communities, attendance at local forums and using our Mobile Police Office.
