Multi Member Ward Plan 2013

This policing plan outlines the priorities you identified during our consultations in 2012. We will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and make people feel safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners to find effective long term solutions to issues you have raised.

Local Priorities

You identified that the following priorities:

1. Antisocial Behaviour

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour and underage drinking

2. Road Safety

You are concerned about collisions, speeding and traffic offences around schools.

3. Housebreaking & Theft

You are concerned about housebreaking and thefts.

4. Community Engagement and Reassurance

You told us it was important to have community officers who you know, who are accessible and who address local problems.

Actions carried out to date

- We have targeted antisocial behaviour through dedicated patrols at locations identified by local people, businesses and community groups as having a particular antisocial behaviour problem.
- We have charged and reported people for a number of antisocial behaviour offences including, vandalism, drinking in public and breach of the peace.
- We have carried out road checks including radar speed checks close to schools and other problem locations leading to a number of drivers being reported for speeding and other road traffic offences.
- We have carried out road checks at key locations and deployed high profile proactive patrols to deter, disrupt and detect travelling criminals targetting our communities.
- Your community police officers have attended community meetings, patrolled your community area and have listened to and addressed your concerns.
- Community Officers have regularly met with and discussed issues of concern with young people at both schools and local youth groups, listening to them and acknowledging their contribution to keeping communities safe.

In the Coming Months

- We will continue to provide dedicated antisocial behaviour patrols that will target locations identified by you as having particular issues which impact on the quality of life in your community.
- We will continue to work closely with local schools and young people in order to maintain and further develop relationships through mutual respect whilst promoting personal and community safety and awareness of antisocial behaviour.
- We will target our road safety patrols at locations which have been highlighted by local communities as having an issue which impacts on the safety of road users.
- We will work with Stirling Council, Housing Associations and other landlords to address those tenants who persistently behave in an antisocial manner, supporting the use of all available measures designed to target antisocial behaviour, and share information to assist in tackling problem tenants.
- We will ensure that our community officers are available in your community to enable you to personally discuss local issues. This will include their attendance at local forums and meetings and maximising use of our Mobile Police Office.
- We will actively target those who supply alcohol to young people. We will take robust action against licensed premises and individuals who break the law including the use of test purchases and reports to the local licensing authority.
