Our focus. Your priorities.

Local Priorities

This report covers the progress we have made in dealing with your priorities and it includes our future plans. Your priorities for the East Kilbride Central North area are:

1. Disorderly Behaviour

You told us your concerns about drunk and disorderly behaviour within your community including public drinking, youth disorder, vandalism and graffiti.

2. Violent Crime

You told us your concerns regarding assault and violent crimes occurring in the community and the connection of these crimes with other forms of antisocial behaviour.

3. Drug Misuse

You told us you were concerned about people dealing illegal drugs and members of the community having witnessed drug taking.

4. Crimes of Dishonesty

You informed us of your concerns regarding housebreaking, car theft and thefts from motor vehicles which were impacting on the community.



Our actions to date.

Disorderly Behaviour

We have continued to provide targeted patrols to deter and disrupt those involved in antisocial behaviour and street drinking at peak times. We issued pre-emptive warnings and carry out enforcement action when warnings were ignored.

Violent Crime

We continually worked closely with our partners to monitor and target violent offenders to keep the community safe. We maintained our high-visibility presence in areas where there is violent crime.

Drug Misuse

We continued to work with the community and partners to gain intelligence on people and premises who are involved in dealing and using controlled drugs. We targeted known drug dealers to reduce the availability of drugs in the area.

Crimes of Dishonesty

We proactively targeted individuals involved in housebreakings and other crimes of dishonesty. We focused on preventative and enforcement activity to deter these crimes. We acted on intelligence received from the community.



In the coming months.

Disorderly Behaviour

We will continue to provide a high-visibility presence in your community, including visits to licensed premises and drinking 'hot spot' areas that you have identified as causing the most concern to your community.

Violent Crime

We will continue to work with partner agencies to focus on 'hot spot' areas within your community. Officers will be deployed in both high-visibility and plain clothes in order to tackle crimes of a violent nature.

Drug Misuse

We will continue to act on intelligence received from the community regarding people who are involved in dealing and using controlled drugs and work with partner agencies to target these individuals.

Crimes of Dishonesty

We will proactively patrol areas affected by housebreaking and theft. Thorough investigations will be conducted to apprehend those responsible. Crime prevention advice and support will be offered.
