This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation and will inform you of how we plan to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners to find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

This policing plan sets out how we intend to deal with your priorities.

Local Priorities

You identified that the policing priorities for the Kinross-shire area were:

1 Speeding

You told us the area that concerned you most was speeding in the community.

2 Drugs

You told us that you were concerned about people using and dealing drugs.

3 Housebreaking

You told us that the fear of your property being broken into was a concern.

We have acted on your concerns and are sure you will have seen improvements in the Kinross-shire area.

Actions Carried Out to Date

- We have continued our proactive approach to tackle speeding throughout Kinross-shire particularly in areas you have highlighted working with the community to influence changes to road design.
- We were one of the first areas to pilot community speed watch seeing the police and community working together to tackle speeding.
- Our officers have made good use of stop and search legislation to tackle drug misuse particularly where this involved using vehicles on the road network.
- We have effectively used intelligence to carry out enforcement activities targeting known drug users.
- Officers used intelligence and technology to target travelling criminals using the road network to commit housebreakings resulting in a marked decrease in this crime type.
- We have continued to maintain a high visibility presence in more rural areas.
- We have used all means at our disposal to promote the fact that Kinross-shire is one of the safest places to live, work and visit in the country.

In the Coming Months

- All officers will continue to be tasked with carrying out speed checks as a default activity on accident risk roads and in areas you have told us about.
- We will tackle speeding and dangerous driving with targeted activity.
- Where there is a community desire we will encourage the use of community speed watch.
- We will continue to gather intelligence on drug misuse and act quickly and effectively to tackle this issue.
- Where possible the Proceeds of Crime Act will be used to seize criminal assets.
- We will continue to provide a high visibility policing presence based on community engagement and listening to you. Innovative engagement methods such as the use of social media will play a key part in this process.
- We will continue 'After Dark' and Homesafe for crime prevention and to provide reassurance to the community.
- We will increase our team working with neighbouring policing areas to target crime.
- We will launch a crime prevention partnership operation to share information and build close links with those living in the farming and rural community.
