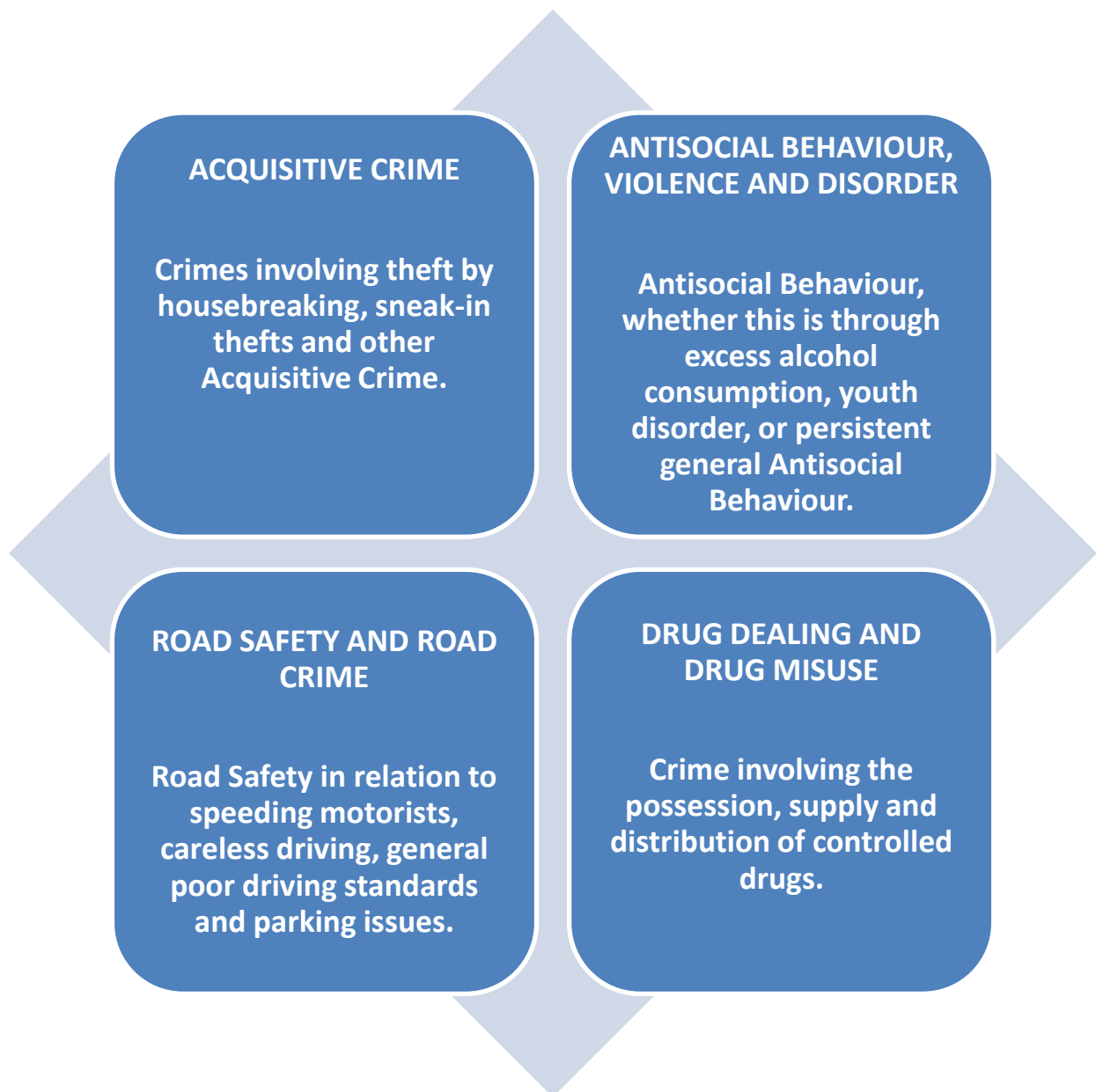

Seaton Community Policing Plan

Local Priorities

This Community Policing Plan outlines the priorities for the Seaton Community Policing Team which were identified through various means of community consultation and organisational assessment. These priorities pose the greatest concern to the communities of Seaton. We will focus our time, energy and resources on reducing the impact of these priorities upon our communities and work together with our partners to keep people safe.

The policing priorities for Seaton Community Policing Team are:

AQUISITIVE CRIME

"As part of our visible patrolling in the area we will be giving particular attention to those areas which have been repeatedly targeted by criminals. Those responsible for such crimes will be the focus of our attention and subject of operational activity for our officers. We'll let you know how we get on. It is important to ensure that premises have appropriate security measures. We will be working with local businesses to ensure that they make it as difficult as possible for anyone intent on committing theft. If you would like crime prevention advice for your own property, commercial or domestic, please get in touch and we'll do everything we can to help."

ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, VIOLENCE AND DISORDER

"Antisocial behaviour affects everyone in the community whether it be vandalism, noise, drunkenness or more serious violent crime including assault or robbery etc. We will carry out regular patrols to combat this and will be in your area dealing with issues you have identified to us. With our community partners we will ensure that we direct our resources in the best possible way to prevent such crimes and where they do occur being in the best position to deal with them. Look out for updates from us in local / social media and if you have any issues you wish to raise please do let your community policing team know."

ROAD SAFETY AND ROAD CRIME

"Casualty reduction on the roads is a key part of the strategy for the team as always and we have plans for enforcement action against those who would drive irresponsibly, particularly in the highly populated area of Seaton. Working with road policing colleagues we will be working hard to keep the streets as safe as possible for all our residents. We are always on the lookout for those who use our roads to commit other types of crime too. If you have any concerns regarding road safety or road crime in your street or elsewhere, then please bring it to the attention of your policing team."

DRUG DEALING AND DRUG MISUSE

"Dealing with drug related activity is always a priority. We will be making use of all the tools we have to identify and deal with those involved in drug supply in our area. Where we are aware of drug dealing occurring within premises you can be confident that we will do our utmost to bring those responsible to the attention of the Courts. We recognise that drug addiction is difficult for people in their lives and would like to reassure you that where we can help someone by directing them to an appropriate service then we have arrangements in place to do so."
