

Tillydrone Community Policing Plan

Local Priorities

This Community Policing Plan outlines the priorities for the Tillydrone Community Policing Team, which were identified through various means of community consultation and organisational assessment. These priorities are the main concerns to the communities within Tillydrone, Woodside and Old Aberdeen. Our focus is to reduce the impact of these priorities upon our community and work together with our partners to keep people safe.

The policing priorities for Tillydrone Community Policing Team are:



Here is what we are going to do this year.

ACQUISITIVE CRIME

"Acquisitive crime includes all types of theft and we will be focused on reducing current levels this year. By employing a range of measures including active patrolling in problem areas, crime reduction campaigning and information / evidence gathering we will actively target those involved in crimes of theft to ensure that they are deterred and where crimes are committed they are detected. We will work with all our community partners to achieve this and will mount policing operations to tackle this. We will work with local businesses to improve security and will work with you to protect your own property by providing you with the most suitable information and advice."

ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR, VIOLENCE AND DISORDER

"Domestic violence is top of our agenda and we will ensure that wherever it is reported to us all steps will be taken to bring the offender to the attention of the Courts. Victims of domestic crime will be given our full support by appropriate community partners with whom we will develop a local support referral scheme. All other violent crime will similarly be prioritised to ensure that support the victim and identify those responsible. You will see our patrols in Tillydrone as they work hard to keep you safe from violent crime. We will be in the local schools to provide our young people with information about antisocial behaviour and its consequences. The quality of life for our residents is very important and by reducing antisocial behaviour we will create better neighbourhoods."

ROAD SAFETY AND ROAD CRIME

"We are committed to making the streets in Tillydrone as safe as they can be and road safety is key to achieving this. Diamond Bridge is somewhere you have told us you are very concerned about due to the speed of some vehicles using this route. We will ensure that we and our partners put in place effective measures to prevent speeding there and across Tillydrone and those who are found to driving irresponsibly will be dealt with appropriately. Those who use our roads to commit crime will be targeted and we will undertake operations, initiatives and collaborative working to deter them from doing so. Inconsiderate parking and abandoned vehicles are issues of concern to you and we will work hard to address this situation."

SERIOUS ORGANISED CRIME

"Drug supply by organised crime groups in the area is an issue we will focus on and we will work hard to detect and disrupt those involved in our community. With our community partners we will gather information on places where drugs are being supplied and on the individuals or groups who are doing so. Where we have sufficient information to act we will do so and ensure that everything that can be done will be done to make our community the most hostile place for those involved in this serious crime to operate."
