Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation. It will inform you of the action we have taken up till now to address those priorities and how we plan to continue to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

You identified that the policing priorities for Inverurie & District area are as follows:

1. Antisocial Behaviour

Especially when fuelled by alcohol, is disturbing the quality of life in your area.

2. Road Safety and Road Crime

You continue to raise concerns over antisocial driving, illegal parking and speeding in built up areas.

3. Community Focus

You want to get to know your local officers and involve them in the wider community.

4. Acquisitive Crime

You are concerned about at the number of break-ins and thefts in your area.

We have listened to your concerns and are working hard to make improvements in the Inverurie & District area.



Our actions to date.

Antisocial Behaviour

We have maintained our commitment to high visibility patrols in known 'hot spot' areas and the dedication of resources to the night time economy, to reduce the risks associated with late night drinking. Operation Berridale was implemented in your area designed to target antisocial behaviour and drug misuse at licensed premises. Working in partnership with licensees, drug detection equipment was used to swab over 300 patrons with valuable intelligence obtained.

Road safety and Road Crime

'Crash! Live,' a partner focussed road safety initiative, delivered key road safety messages to an audience from across Garioch. We instigated Operation Berrigan, a longer term Garioch-wide initiative to address antisocial driving which saw positive results. We used all of the tactics at our disposal including engagement with young drivers through to confiscating the vehicles of persistent offenders to address 'circuit' driving.

Community Focus

We have regularly attended community meetings to let you know about policing in your area and used our 'Twitter' feed to give you the latest updates. We have patrolled our towns and villages on bikes to deliver increased levels of public reassurance. We made good use of our Special Constables, who play an important role supporting the wider Garioch policing team. They especially assist in bolstering our numbers in relation to shows and events, weekend policing and initiatives in respect of antisocial behaviour and road safety.

Acquisitive Crime

We have maintained our resource commitment to Operation Ruby to tackle thefts of vehicles and reiterated our crime reduction message to lock and secure your property. Local officers have carried out high visibility foot and mobile patrols in areas where we have seen an increase in break-ins to deter thieves and provide reassurance.

In the coming months.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will maintain a high visibility presence and will act on reports of youth annoyance. We will remain an active member of the local Pubwatch Group and will consult with Community Councils to address emerging and ongoing issues. We will maintain our night time weekend policing plan, visiting licenced premises and patrolling 'hot spots', making use of our powers where offences are detected.

Road Safety and Road Crime

In partnership with Roads Policing colleagues, we will give attention to areas affected by antisocial driving. We will continue to work with local communities to address their concerns about antisocial, using education and enforcement measures to improve road safety.

Community Focus

We will continue to engage with Community Councils, Ward Forums and other forms of partnership with a policing purpose. This will be with the aim of preventing and detecting crime as affecting local people. We will enhance our visible and accessible presence.

We will act upon information you provide us regarding suspicious activities. We will focus our patrols in the areas experiencing incidents of housebreaking and we will target those involved in all forms of theft.

Acquisitive Crime

Local officers supported by specialist teams will continue to undertake high visibility patrols in the area, seeking to deter and detect criminals engaged in thefts. We will engage in providing crime reduction advice regarding sneak-in thefts, break-ins and car crime to areas that are being targeted by criminals and seek to reduce the easy targets available to criminals.
