Cumbernauld South

Multi Member Ward Plan 2016

Our focus. Your priorities.

This report covers the progress we have made in dealing with your priorities and it includes our future plans. Your priorities for the Cumbernauld South area are:

1. Drug Misuse

You told us that drug misuse and drug dealing was of concern.

2. Antisocial Behaviour

You told us that rowdy, drunken and disorderly behaviour was occurring within your community.

3. Dishonesty

You told us of your concerns about housebreakings and other forms of theft, including theft from motor vehicles.

4. Road Safety

You told us speeding motorists and other forms of antisocial driving were causing you concern.

Our actions to date.

Drug Misuse

We continued to develop community intelligence on people who deal in and use controlled drugs. Local crime units have targeted those responsible and executed warrants at addresses where drug dealing is taking place. When drug dealing was detected, we have shared this information with North Lanarkshire Council to support tenancy action.

Antisocial Behaviour

We introduced 'timeline visits' at weekends, with officers directed to patrol at key locations and key times linked to specific antisocial behaviour through incident analysis. Where repeated antisocial behaviour occurred at particular addresses, we shared information and worked with our partners at North Lanarkshire Council to identify long term solutions to problems.

Dishonesty

We carried out through the night patrols in an effort to deter and detect those responsible for crimes of dishonesty. We maximised all forensic opportunities, using specialist technicians to gather evidence from crime scenes. We utilised dedicated enquiry teams to investigate all instances of housebreaking to identify patterns and target suspects.

Road Safety

We shared your concerns relating to speeding motorists with specialist colleagues to allow them to target enforcement activity in the area. We policed ad hoc specialist car events to prevent disruption to general road users.



In the coming months.

Drug Misuse

We will remain visible in the community to develop intelligence on people who deal in and use controlled drugs. We will target drug dealers to reduce the availability of drugs and will continue to work with our partners, combining education and enforcement strategies.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to use directed 'timeline patrols' at weekends to deter and disrupt those involved in antisocial behaviour. We will issue pre-emptive warnings at problem addresses and carry out enforcement action when warnings are ignored. We will continue to use our links with all local partners, including North Lanarkshire Council, to share information and identify long term solutions to recurring problems in the Ward and surrounding area. We will target drinking in public places by patrolling 'hotspot' areas and issuing fixed penalty notices to those who engage in rowdy behaviour in the street.

Road Safety

We will continue to work with our colleagues from specialist departments to carry out enforcement activity relating to speeding motorists. Community police officers will patrol in prominent locations and carry out periodic road checks to positively influence driver behaviour.

Dishonesty

We will continue to patrol at key times to deter and detect those responsible for crimes of dishonesty. We will continue to offer crime prevention and security advice to improve security at vulnerable premises. We will develop community intelligence and where suspects are identified, will target them and prioritise their arrest.
