Our focus. Your priorities.

Local Priorities

This report covers the progress we have made in dealing with your priorities and it includes our future plans. Your priorities for the Thorniewood area are:

1. Violence/Antisocial Behaviour

You informed us that anti social behaviour and violent crime was affecting your local community.

2. Drug Misuse

You informed us that drug misuse and drug dealing within your community was causing you concern.

3. Dishonesty

You told us that you had concerns regarding crimes of dishonesty and suspicious persons in your community.

4. Vandalism

You told us that graffiti and vandalism to property was an issue in your local area.

Our actions to date.

Violence/Antisocial Behaviour

Utilising thorough incident analysis and specific community intelligence has enabled us to direct our resources to key areas to deter, detect and disrupt this type of behaviour.

Drug Misuse

We have targeted individuals who are involved in dealing illegal drugs to people in your community. We have used community intelligence to identify those involved and used enforcement to bring them to justice. We have directed resources to areas most affected by drug misuse.

Dishonesty

We have worked in partnership with specialist departments to engage with victims of crimes of dishonesty. By providing the most relevant and up to date crime prevention advice to improve the safety of our communities.

Vandalism

We have worked closely with the local community in partnership with North Lanarkshire Council to identify crime trends and target specific areas with directed patrols to disrupt this activity. Thorough investigation and community engagement has allowed us to detect offenders.



In the coming months.

Violence/Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to engage with partners and proactively target those who have been identified as being persistent violent offenders and those involved in antisocial behaviour. We will direct our patrols to key areas to deter such behaviour. We will work with licensed premises to promote education regarding the associated risks involved in excessive alcohol consumption.

Drug Misuse

We will direct our resources to areas that have been identified as being prevalent in this type of activity. Utilising community intelligence we will continue to target those individuals identified as being involved in the supply of illegal drugs. We will endeavour to use our powers under the Proceeds of Crime Act to seize assets and disrupt future activities of those involved.

Dishonesty

We will use incident analysis to direct our resources to 'hot spot' areas with the intention of detecting those involved and bringing them to justice. We will pro-actively target those involved in this type of activity and use all available tactics to assist us in doing so. We will engage with the public and act on information received.

Vandalism

We will continue to work closely with the local community in partnership with North Lanarkshire Council to identify crime trends and target specific areas with directed patrols to disrupt this activity. Thorough investigation and community engagement has allowed us to detect offenders and this will continue.
