Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation. It will inform you of the action we have taken up until now to address those priorities and how we plan to continue to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

You identified that the policing priorities for Carse of Gowrie area were:

1. Speeding and Inappropriate Driving

You told us the area that concerned you most was vehicle's being driven inappropriately and vehicles being driven at excessive speed.

2. Drug Abuse / Drug Dealing

You told us your concerns about people misusing drugs and dealing drugs in your community.

3. Antisocial Behaviour

You told us your concerns about young people engaging in acts of antisocial behaviour including vandalism.

4. Theft and Housebreaking

You told us the fear of having your property (residential or commercial) being broken into was a concern.

We have acted on your concerns and are sure you will have seen improvements in the Carse of Gowrie area.

Our actions to date.

Speeding and Inappropriate Driving

We have targeted specific roads identified by you and carried out road checks and used tools such as speed detecting devices in an effort to make your roads safer.

Drug Abuse/ Drug Dealing

You told us your concerns about people misusing drugs and dealing drugs in your community. We identified areas of concern and focussed patrols in the area and used intelligence to target dealers.

Antisocial Behaviour

You told us your concerns surrounding this. We have focussed patrols in the identified areas and set up initiatives such as Operation Quest, created for officers to focus on this type of behaviour in our Community.

Theft and Housebreaking

We have ensured officers have been dedicated to tackle and prevent these crimes, we have made efforts to disrupt known offenders and carried out focussed patrols under Operation After Dark.

In the coming months.

Speeding and Inappropriate Driving

We will continue to work with local communities to identify areas where irresponsible driving takes place and take the appropriate measures to reduce it. Patrols will continue to be carried out targeting inappropriate driving through education and enforcement.

Drug Abuse/ Drug Dealing

We will continue to gather and develop intelligence to disrupt drug dealers. Drug users will be dealt with robustly and support offered through organisations such as the Perth and Kinross Drug and Alcohol Team.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will aim to reduce the risk of harm caused by alcohol related violence and instances of antisocial behaviour by targeting problem areas with initiatives such as Operation Quest.

Theft and Housebreaking

We will continue to target those responsible for crimes of dishonesty, in particular those who break into domestic and commercial premises, utilising intelligence and partnership working.
