Multi Member Ward Plan 2016

Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation. It will inform you of the action we have taken up till now to address those priorities and how we plan to continue to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

You identified that the policing priorities for Coldside are as follows:

1. Drug Dealing and Misuse

You told us your concerns regarding the supply and use of drugs that cause antisocial behaviour and crime in your area.

2. Violent Crime

You told us that crimes of violence including domestic violence were causing you concern.

3. Antisocial Behaviour

You told us your concerns in relation to rowdy and drunken behaviour in your community.

4. Road Safety

You told us speeding motorists and other forms of antisocial driving were causing you concern.

We have listened to your concerns and comments and hopefully you will have continued to see further improvements in the Coldside area.



Our actions to date.

Drug Dealing and Misuse

We have continued to develop community intelligence on people who deal in and use controlled drugs through our partnership "Ditch a Dealer" initiative. Community officers and specialist officers have targeted those responsible through enforcement activity. We have worked closely with the Antisocial Behaviour Team to ensure that they have information on those involved with a view to eviction. Through Operation Slate we will continue to focus on tackling the supply and misuse of controlled drugs.

Violent Crime

We have specialist resources to deal with domestic abuse so that victims are supported and safe. We have deployed officers involved in the Campaign against Violence to support the community officers in the area at peak times to prevent and reduce the fear of violence. We launched Operation Quest on 17th September 2015, which is a coordinated response to violent crime and antisocial behaviour.

Antisocial Behaviour

We have carried out regular patrols in areas of antisocial behaviour and underage alcohol consumption. We have conducted visits to addresses that cause you concern. We have supported our partners to ensure that inconsiderate householders are aware of concerns and are dealt with robustly. We have introduced a briefing programme with Community Safety Wardens who work in your area to ensure a coordinated response.

Road Safety

We have ensured that specialist resources are deployed to deal with speeding motorists and we have conducted regular activity at schools and areas of known antisocial driving. We have carried out ad hoc operations in your area in relation to the use of mobile telephones when driving or failure to wear seatbelts. We have supported our partners in the delivery of the Safe Drive/Stay Alive presentations to S5 and S6 pupils.



In the coming months.

Drug Dealing and Misuse

We will continue to develop intelligence on people involved in the supply of drugs. We will share information with our partners within Dundee City Council and registered social landlords to identify long term solutions to recurring problems in the Coldside Multi Member Ward. Where intelligence exists we will seek search warrants to seize drugs and report offenders. We will coordinate this pro-activity through our Divisional Operation Slate, focussing on tackling the supply and misuse of controlled drugs.

Violent Crime

We will continue to provide a high visibility presence in the area at key times through the Campaign against Violence. We will continue to work with victims of domestic abuse to ensure their safety. We will regularly engage with known violent offenders to deter them. We will work with licensees to support them in keeping their patrons safe. For those who commit violent offences we will continue to ensure that they adhere to bail conditions through regular visits to them.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to use a multiagency approach to dealing with young people involved in antisocial behaviour. We will conduct joint visits and work with local schools to make offenders aware of the impact their behaviour has on the community. We will work with our partners to effectively target addresses causing noise nuisance and will carry out visits to these addresses in tandem with the use of legislation. Through Operation Challenge we will target the antisocial and dangerous use of motor cycles.

Road Safety

Through Operation Synergy we will continue to focus on all aspects of road safety and road traffic legislation enforcement. We will continue to use specialist resources to target inconsiderate and speeding drivers. We will use technology to target those who drive without insurance or licences. We will continue to deploy community officers and mobile CCTV at schools to deal with inconsiderate and dangerous parking. We will continue through local and national operations such as the Festive Road Campaign to target road traffic offenders.
