Our focus. Your priorities.

This policing plan will outline the priorities your community identified during our most recent consultation. It will inform you of the action we have taken up until now to address those priorities and how we plan to continue to address them throughout the year.

Our focus is to reduce crime and disorder, to increase public reassurance within your community and to keep people safe.

We will continue to work closely with our partners and find effective long-term solutions to the issues you raised.

Local Priorities

You identified that the policing priorities for Strathearn Ward area are as follows:

1. Antisocial Behaviour

You told us that you had concerns about people, particularly young people, obtaining alcohol and engaging in antisocial behaviour. You were concerned about the impact this was having on the Strathearn Community.

2. Speeding & Inconsiderate Parking

You told us that speeding motorists and inconsiderate parking were issues causing you concern in your area, particularly near to schools.

3. Dishonesty

You told us of your concerns about housebreakings and other forms of rural theft including theft of motor vehicles, farm machinery and fuel.

4. Bogus Workers

You told us your concerns about bogus workers in your area preying on the vulnerable, particularly the elderly, in your community.

We have acted on your concerns and are sure you will have seen improvements in the Strathearn Ward area.



Our actions to date.

Antisocial Behaviour

Under Operation Ironworks we carried out increased high visibility patrols to tackle antisocial behaviour in the national park area of St Fillans. Under Operation Quest we carried out focussed activity to tackle antisocial behaviour and violent crime in Crieff.

Speeding and Inconsiderate Driving

Officers have carried out intelligence led speed checks and several tickets have been issued. We now have a new process to regularly share information with Perth and Kinross Council for long term problem solving in key areas.

Dishonesty

We have worked closely with our police colleagues in neighbouring local authority areas to carry out co-ordinated road checks targeting travelling criminals including housebreakers. We successfully detected commercial housebreakers in the Crieff area.

Bogus Workers

Under Operation Monarda aimed at stopping doorstep crime, we carried out increased patrols stopping vans and gathering intelligence. We worked with banks and post offices to educate on how to identify vulnerable persons being targeted by these offenders.



In the coming months.

Antisocial Behaviour

We will continue to carry out intelligence led patrols in problem areas. We will work with our partners to implement positive diversionary activities for young people and work with licensed premises to ensure good management of premises.

Speeding and Inconsiderate Driving

We will continue to work with our colleagues in specialist departments to carry out enforcement activity on speeding motorists, paying particular attention to schools at the beginning and end of the school day.

Dishonesty

As the nights get darker earlier we will be reminding residents to review their home security and to report any suspicious activity. We will continue to carry out road checks to target travelling criminals.

Bogus Workers

We will continue to respond to reports of suspicious activity and work with Trading Standards to carry out enforcement and education activity to deter, disrupt and detect this type of activity.

Domestic Abuse

We will visit victims of domestic abuse to ensure they are safe. Domestic perpetrators will be checked on a regular basis to ensure that they do not re-offend in any way. We will continue to manage this via our Domestic Management Toolkit.
