## **Anti Social Behaviour Policy**

The Police Service of Scotland, (hereafter referred to as Police Scotland), recognises that individuals have the right to live in peace and safety, free from all aspects of antisocial and criminal behaviour, without fear of harassment and/or intimidation. Accordingly, Police Scotland is committed to effectively tackling and preventing antisocial behaviour in order to safeguard the future and well-being of our communities.

Police Scotland will achieve this by working in partnership with Community Planning partners, responding to local needs, concerns and priorities in accordance with the provisions of the Antisocial Behaviour etc (Scotland) Act 2004, and any other legislative provisions enacted by Parliament or Scottish Ministers.

All related activities will take cognisance of Police Scotland's values of Integrity, Fairness and Respect, underpinned by its Code of Ethics and Human Rights considerations.
