FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

Please may you provide me with reports made to the police made since April 30, 2021 that included mention of Apple's AirTags product.

In response to your request, I must stress first of all that Police Scotland do not consider key word searches for specific words/ phrases to be an accurate means of analysis in most circumstances and there may well be incidents of relevance to your request which do not include the specific phrases listed.

Notwithstanding, a keyword search was carried out on our STORM *incident recording* system for - AirTag, Air-Tag and Air Tag.

I can advise you there have been 60 incidents recorded under the following disposal codes:

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
