FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

How many snare licences are issued annually in Scotland by area?

In response to your request, I must first of all advise you that SHOGUN is the national system used by Police Scotland for the management of firearms licensing and is a register of all people who have applied for, or have been granted, a certificate to possess a firearm, shotgun or air weapon.

SHOGUN is a live operational database which is continually updated therefore only represents a snapshot of time. As such, I can only advise you that as at 22nd November 2022, 1,903 snare licences have been applied for.

I am unable to provide any further breakdown of this data, and as such, in terms of Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, this represents a notice that the information you seek is not held by Police Scotland.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions. If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.
