## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

The information provided relates *only* to speeding offences detected by Safety Cameras Scotland and does not reflect those detected by Police Officers at the roadside.

Information regarding detected speeding offences by roadside Officers are recorded on various crime recording systems and, unfortunately, whilst high level figures are available, it is not possible to determine any further details without case by case assessment of each offence.

As illustrated by our <u>published statistics</u>, this would involve individual assessment of thousands of crime reports. Even with a conservative estimate of allowing five minutes to interrogate each record, any such exercise would cost in excess of the £600 cost limit set out in the Fees Regulations.

I therefore regret to inform you that I am unable to provide you with the information you have requested in relation these offences, as it would prove too costly to do so within the context of the fee regulations.

As such, and in terms of Section 16(4) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 where Section 12(1) of the Act (Excessive Cost of Compliance) has been applied, this represents a refusal notice for the information sought.

On that basis, the below response refers to speeding offences detected by the Safety Camera Unit. Information has been taken from a live system which is subject to change and correct as of 23/02/2022.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

## 1. How many speeding offences did your force detect in the 2021 calendar year (1 January to 31 December, inclusive)?

62,751 Speeding Offences were detected by Safety Camera Scotland from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2021 – 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021.

'Offences' is defined as 'total number of activations where an offence can be proven to have taken place', which excludes emergency services vehicle exemptions and other non-offences.

2. Please provide a breakdown of how these offences were detected (i.e. via fixed speed camera, mobile speed camera, police officer with radar gun etc).
