## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

- 1. How many historic sexual abuses have been reported to police in Scotland?
- 2. How many such a case have been referred to the procurator's fiscal office?

Following a request for clarification of **historic** you asked for data regarding crimes that **took place some time ago**, thereafter further clarified as **in between 5 and ten years**.

All group 2 (sexual) crimes *recorded* between 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017 and 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021 were extracted and the difference in days between the '*Date Raised*' and the '*Committed Date*' was then calculated.

Records where the difference in days was greater than 1,825 and less than 3,650 were then selected. Recorded and detected crime data on that basis is as follows:

All statistics are provisional and should be treated as management information.

All data have been extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and are correct as at 8th June 2022.

## 3. How many people have been arrested using Moorov doctrine?

Please be advised that Police Scotland does not record whether an individual has been arrested using the Moorov Doctrine and as such, in terms of Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, this represents a notice that the information you seek is not held by Police Scotland.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
