I can confirm the following agencies have used Police Scotland Police cells between the dates of 1st January 2019 to 31st December 2021 as follows;

Ministry of Defence	32
UK Border Agency	29
Civil Nuclear Constabulary	0

These figures are per person in custody.

We have no records of Civil Nuclear Constabulary using the Police cells in Scotland during that period of time.

Please supply policy/agreements in place for the above using Police Scotland custody suites.

I can confirm that following a search of our systems, we do not hold any specific agreements in regards to the above. As such, in terms of Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, this represents a notice that the information requested is not held by Police Scotland.
