FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

Please can you provide me with the number of reported offences involving Dangerous Dogs, giving totals for each (calendar) year – from 2017 until the date of this FOI request? If possible, please can you provide me with details of the geographical area in which the offence took place, and if possible the nature of the offence?

In response to your request, please see the table below. I regret to inform you that I am unable to provide you with the exact nature of the offence, as it would prove too costly to do so within the context of the fee regulations.

As you may be aware the current cost threshold is £600 and I estimate that it would cost well in excess of this amount to process your request.

As such, and in terms of Section 16(4) of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 where Section 12(1) of the Act (Excessive Cost of Compliance) has been applied, this represents a refusal notice for the information sought.

By way of explanation, the only way to provide an accurate response would be to manually extract a summary of each offence from the crime report.

Given the volume of reports this is an exercise which would far exceed the cost limit set out in the Fees Regulations.

All statistics are provisional and should be treated as management information. All data have been extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and are correct as at 12th September 2022.

The Recorded Crimes were extracted using the Date Raised, and then selecting the Stats Class Codes:

'605110 - Dangerous Dogs, Failure to Control, Supervise, Destroy'

'605111 - Dogs bred for fighting'

'605112 - Keeping dogs under prop ctrl, contrav of an order'
