Furthermore, in light of other forces request to clarify A and B: reports with ALL key words. B and C repots with only the 3 key words in the notes: this is to compare all reports with reports only concerning apple.

In response to your request, I can advise you that Police Scotland record crimes using the Scottish Government Justice Department crime classification codes rather than Home Office classifications. As such, in terms of Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, this represents a notice that the information you seek is not held by Police Scotland.

However, I can advise you that I have considered your request and in terms of the Act, I regret to inform you that I am unable to provide you with the information you have requested, as it would prove too costly to do so within the context of the fee regulations.

By way of explanation it is not possible to carry out keyword searches in relation to crime reports, therefore each and every one would have to be examined to establish relevancy - an exercise which I estimate would far exceed the cost limit set out in the Fees Regulations.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to foi@scotland.police.uk or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
