What is Project Servator?



Project Servator is a way the police work to stop criminals and terrorists doing things that are against the law.

A criminal is someone who commits a crime.



A terrorist is someone who uses violence to frighten the public and threaten governments.



Project Servator helps the public to feel safe.

Police teams can be anywhere at any time.

What you will see



Project Servator is different to normal police work.

The police officers have special training to spot people who may be planning or preparing to commit a crime.



This means looking for criminals planning all types of crime – from shoplifting in the town centre to preparing a terrorist attack.



The police officers might have guns or work with police dogs and horses.



If Project Servator is in your area, there is nothing to worry about.

This is normal police work.



You will see police officers speaking to people and local businesses to tell them what they are doing.



They will remind people to tell the police about anything that seems different or unusual or makes them feel worried.



Do not be surprised if you see Project Servator.

We are there to help keep you safe.

You can talk to our officers to find out more.

How you can help



It is important that you report anything that does not look or sound right.



This could be something that has been left like a bag or a rucksack.



It could be someone acting in a strange or unusual way.



Tell a police officer or a member of staff in the shop or business straight away.

You can also call the police on 101.



In an emergency always call 999.



Do not think that someone else will already have reported it.



If it doesn't feel right report it.

Together we will help keep people safe.
