A. Summary of Analysis / Decisions - What the assessment found and actions already taken.

This SOP is an information and guidance document where further advice and clarity is required due to the recent amendments to Public Sector Corruption, Bribery and Defalcation.

The SOP is designed to ensure that all investigative or preventative activity by Police Scotland in relation to Fraud is consistent and proportionate across the country. This SOP augments several SOPs which have been subject of the EIA process and are designed to remove any existing inequality/disadvantage that may occur during the process of investigating Fraud.

In addition the assessment of this document found there were potential impacts on AGE; DISABILITY; RACE; RELIGION or BELIEF. These were analysed, assessed and mitigated accordingly where Police Officers and Police Staff are directed to refer to the appropriate SOP for further guidance.

This document, due to its nature, also promotes Article 6 of the European Convention of Human Rights. In addition it was found that ECHR articles 5, 8 & Protocol 1 (Article 1) were infringed. These were analysed, assessed and mitigated accordingly.
