## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

**I'm writing to request data on the following aspects of vehicle crime for the 2021 calendar year under the Freedom of Information Act:**

- a) The number of offences recorded under the offence codes DR10 to DR61, and DG10 to DG90.**
- b) The number of offences under the offence code IN10.**
- c) The number of people caught by speed cameras.**

Having considered your request in terms of the above Act, I must first of all advise you that the codes listed in your request are Licence Endorsement codes and Police Scotland does not record offences in those terms.

As such, in terms of Section 17 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, this represents a notice that the information you seek is not held by Police Scotland.

Crimes in Scotland are recorded in accordance with the Scottish Government Justice Department (SGJD) [offence classification codes](#).

If it is of some interest, we can provide statistics on any SGJD code and we can also provide data in relation to speed cameras. We would however require you to confirm whether you are interested in fixed and/or mobile sites, or average speed cameras. We would also require clarification on whether you would be requesting detections or Fixed Penalty Notices (FPNs) issued/ reports to the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscals Service (COPFS) etc.

Should you require any further assistance please contact Information Management Dundee, quoting the reference number given.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

## OFFICIAL

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to [foi@scotland.pnn.police.uk](mailto:foi@scotland.pnn.police.uk) or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
