## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

We are making a request under the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002 for information relating to all collisions/accidents occurring on the A92, The Parkway in Aberdeen.

We are seeking to access information/documentation concerning any knowledge of and all reports of collisions/accidents which have occurred on the A92, the Parkway, in Aberdeen within the last five years. In particular, we would be obliged if you could provide the number of accidents/collisions which have occurred between the roundabouts at Laurel Drive and Whitestripes Avenue, which have occurred within the last 5 years.

The tables below provides the number of Road Traffic Collisions and Casualties at the specified area from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016 – 30<sup>th</sup> November 2021, by severity.

Please note, only calendar years with a collision recorded have been displayed.

All statistics are provisional and should be treated as management information. All data have been extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and are correct as at 02/12/2021. Data excludes non-injury collisions as per standard operating procedure.

On the 12th June 2019, CRaSH was implemented within D Division. On the 3rd July 2019, CRaSH was implemented across the other Police Divisions within Police Scotland. CRaSH replaced the existing procedures for recording Road Traffic Collisions.

Specified areas have been selected using the Grid East and Grid North recorded on the Road Traffic Collision Report. Records which are located between the roundabout near to Laurel Drive, and the roundabout near to Whitestripes Avenue (Aberdeen) on the A90 have been selected. Please note, each record will need to be read to confirm the exact location.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions. If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
