FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

In follow-up to IM-FOI-2021-1441 and IM-FOI-2022-0192:

Further GDPR/FOI and/or EIR requests re "Lochgelly Public Park" (South side park close to the Avenue)

Please can Police Scotland supply the following information?

As per previous requests, the following area within the red line shown on the image below was used as the basis for the search.



1: How many anti social, arson/fire raising or alleged threat and violence have been raised on the Storm system within from the period of the 31st of March 2022 to the 3rd of May 2022, relating to the Lochgelly Public Park, near The Avenue, Lochgelly?

A search was conducted of our Storm incident system using the initial incident types of 1. 'CR-78' (Damage); 2. 'AB-24' (Public Nuisance); 3. 'AB-28' (Disturbance); 4. 'AB-53' (Noise); 5. 'AB-55' (Drinking in public); 6. 'AB-56' (Neighbour Dispute); 7. 'AB-57' (Communication).

These were then extracted and plotted on the specified location using ArcGIS Mapping Software (based on the Grid East and Grid North which relates to where Police Officers were directed to attend). No incidents were found that mapped to the area of the park during the period requested.

2: How many police attendances where there?

As per my answer to question 1, as there were no incidents recorded during this period, there were therefore no police attendances noted on our Storm incident system during the period requested.

3: How many Charges, cautions, warnings or FPNs took place over this time in this area?

A search of recorded and detected crimes was made and extracted using the date raised. All records were then extracted and plotted on the specified location using ArcGIS Mapping Software (based on the Grid East and Grid North). No recorded or detected crimes were found that mapped to the area of the park during the period requested.

4: How many “reported to Children’s reporter” were there?

As per my answer to question 3, as there were no crimes recorded or detected during this period, there were therefore no crimes reported to the Children’s Reporter during the period requested.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
