FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

Please provide me with copies of all Drug Trend Bulletins produced by Police Scotland in 2022.

In terms of Section 16 of the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002, I am refusing to provide you with the information sought.

Section 16 requires Police Scotland, when refusing to provide such information because it is exempt, to provide you with a notice which:

- (a) states that it holds the information,
- (b) states that it is claiming an exemption,
- (c) specifies the exemption in question and
- (d) states, if that would not be otherwise apparent, why the exemption applies.

I can confirm that Police Scotland holds the information that you have requested.

The exemption that I consider to be applicable the information requested by you is:

Section 35(1)(a)&(b) - Law Enforcement

The information requested is exempt, as its disclosure would or would be likely to prejudice substantially the prevention or detection of crime and/ or the apprehension or prosecution of offenders.

Disclosure of the information would provide a clear insight as to the current intelligence picture in relation to drug offending, information that would be of value to criminals seeking to determine whether their activities/ products had come to police attention and if so, to what extent.

Public Interest Test

Whilst disclosure would increase public awareness regarding this issue, there can be no parallel interest in disclosing information that would make it more difficult for Police Scotland to monitor and respond to the issue of drug offending.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.
