FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

Proposed Road Safety Initiative – Hawkhead Road, Paisley

I came home today to see that your ‘people’ had put a sticker on my bin. I would like to know how much this has exercise has cost me as a tax payer.

The Road Safety Initiative referred to in your request involves attaching stickers to the side of wheelie bins in an effort to remind drivers of the 30mph speed limit in the area.

The stickers are purchased by Safety Cameras Scotland and printed internally at a cost of £1,242 for 3,000 stickers. This works out at 41p a sticker.

700 stickers were used on Hawkhead Road, with each householder receiving 8 stickers.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to foi@scotland.police.uk or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
