FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

How many times police have been called to reports of a disturbance taking place at the junction of Argyle Street/Jamaica Street outside McDonalds in Glasgow city centre - ie the Four Corners - since the start of 2022.

In response to your request, I can advise that between 1 January and 31 July 2022 there are 46 incidents recorded at this location that are classified as *disturbance*.

All statistics are provisional and should be treated as management information. All data have been extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and are correct as at 25th August 2022.

The Grid East and Grid North attributed to the Storm Incident were plotted on an ArcGIS Map. Incidents located within a 25 metre radius around the junction where Argyle Street meets Jamaica Street, Glasgow were selected. Please note, the Grid East and Grid North relates to where Police Officers are directed to attend.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to foi@scotland.pnn.police.uk or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
