FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

- The number of recorded accidents or collisions involving cyclists, pedestrians, or motorised vehicles recorded at the junction of Springvalley Gardens and Springvalley Terrace (Edinburgh) in the last 18 months (31/07/2020 to 31/01/2022)
- If the resolution of the data allows it, the number of accidents or collisions specifically at the junction mentioned above should be provided.
- If the resolution of the data allows it, the number of accidents or collisions within 20 yards of the junction should be provided.
- If the resolution does not allow data to be provided for the specific junction, data should be provided for both Springvalley Gardens and Springvalley Terrace.
- Only summary data is requested e.g. number of collisions or accidents in the last 18 months. I request no details that would enable identification of individuals.

The table below provides the number of Road Traffic incidents recorded on Police Scotland's incident recording system, Storm, at the specified location from 31st July 2020 – 31st January 2022:-

All statistics are provisional and should be treated as management information. All data have been extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and are correct as at 17/02/2022. Data has been extracted from the SEB-P database. The data was extracted using the incident's raised date and by using final incident codes TR-41 (Road Traffic Collision) and TR-43 (Road Traffic Matter).

Specified areas have been selected using GIS Mapping using the Grid East and Grid North attached to the incident. Specified areas have also been selected using a keyword search on the locus line.







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Please note, the locus recorded on the Storm Incident is where the Police Officers are directed to attend. Each record would need to read to confirm the exact location of the incident.

It should be noted that on the 3rd July 2019, CRaSH was implemented across all Police Divisions within Police Scotland. CRaSH replaced the existing procedures for recording Road Traffic Collisions.

I can confirm that there are no Road Traffic Collisions recorded on CRaSH, at the specified location for the time period requested. This data is correct as at 03/02/2022.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions. Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to foi@scotland.police.uk or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
