## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

**The top 10 streets in Glasgow (eg. Glasgow division or local authority area) with the highest number of Police Scotland call-outs (eg. recorded Storm incidents) in each of the last three years (and the number of call-outs in each case).**

Please see the below table which provides the top 10 streets within the Greater Glasgow Division with the highest number of recorded STORM incidents from 01 May 2019 – 31 May 2022.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
