I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

Please could you tell me the number of times in 2022, 2021 and 2020 broken down my month, drivers have been caught speeding by the average speed cameras on the A90 between Aberdeen and Dundee?

For each, could you tell me the speeds detected.

The purpose of the Safety Camera Programme is to contribute to Scotland's road safety vision and road safety targets, realised through targeted camera enforcement and improving driver behaviour.

In order to protect the enforcement threshold the volume of speeds in which drivers are detected have been provided in 'speed ranges'.

I must also advise you that as the information provided below is taken from a live database, the information is subject to change as further details are updated. The information is therefore correct as at 26/10/2022.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.
