FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

I am concerned about a proposal from Fife Council regarding re-zoning houses in the 'Heathers' area from Touch Primary to Carnegie Primary in Dunfermline. The rezoned houses will all access the school via Kellock Avenue / McBaith Way which are already very busy and dangerous.

Please could you provide me with a note of how many complaints /incidents have been reported to Police Scotland regarding parking /traffic in Kellock Avenue /McBaith Way, Dunfermline, at school drop off / pick up times?

Following a clarification request you confirmed that you wanted figures for the past 5 years and that you defined school drop off/pick up times as between 08:30 and 09:15 and between 14:45 and 15:30 from Monday to Friday.

Please find the requested information in the table below. I would ask that you note the caveats provided below the data table.

Title: Selected STORM incidents, Kellock Avenue and McBaith Way, Dunfermline - between the hours of 0830 and 0915, 1445 and 1530, Broken on Final Incident Type.
Period: 1st August 2018 to 30th November 2022, Calendar Years.

All statistics are provisional and should be treated as management information. All data have been extracted from Police Scotland internal systems and are correct as at 5/12/2022.

1. The data was extracted using the incident's raised date and by using Disposal codes TR-41 (Road Traffic Collision) and TR-43 (Road Traffic Matter).
2. Duplicate, linked, transferred and error incidents have been removed.
3. Specified areas have been selected using GIS Mapping. A polygon was created around Kellock Avenue and McBaith Way, Dunfermline, and a keyword search was carried out on the incident locus line. Relevant records were selected.

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I can further advise that following a manual review of the incidents above, 2 of these relate to parking issues, none of them relate to traffic issues.

If you are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to foi@scotland.police.uk or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision. Should you wish to appeal against the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner's decision, there is an appeal to the Court of Session on a point of law only.
