## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002**

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

### **What Divisions have COS Unifi been rolled out to?**

COS UNIFI has now been rolled out to all Divisions except C and P Divisions (as at 10/08/2022) with C Division scheduled to come onto the national systems on 16<sup>th</sup> November 2022.

For clarity, UNIFI Crime and Warrants Modules is now available to D, N and A Divisions (on 21/9/21, 22/3/22 and 10/08/22 respectively) and will be rolled out to C Division on 16/11/22.

Completion of the roll-out of UNIFI Productions, Crime and Warrants modules is being targeted by the end of 2023.

### **And what legacy systems have now been retired?**

The legacy N Division system (ABM Impact) has been decommissioned. The decommissioning of legacy D Division, UNIFI, is scheduled prior to the end of Phase 2 roll out, as are the other legacy systems.

If you require further assistance or are dissatisfied with the way in which Police Scotland has dealt with your request, you are entitled, in the first instance, to request a review of our actions and decisions.

Your request must specify the matter which gives rise to your dissatisfaction and it must be submitted within 40 working days of receiving this response - either by email to [foi@scotland.police.uk](mailto:foi@scotland.police.uk) or by post to Information Management (Disclosure), Police Scotland, Clyde Gateway, 2 French Street, Dalmarnock, G40 4EH.

If you remain dissatisfied following the outcome of that review, you are thereafter entitled to apply to the Office of the Scottish Information Commissioner within six months for a decision.
