- **2.** Attends voluntarily at a police station for the purpose of being questioned on suspicion of having committed an offence.
- **3.** Is to be interviewed by police in accordance with Section 35 of the Criminal Justice (Scotland) Act 2016 (Officially Accused Post Charge Questioning).
