## FREEDOM OF INFORMATION (SCOTLAND) ACT 2002

I refer to your recent request for information which has been handled in accordance with the Freedom of Information (Scotland) Act 2002.

For ease of reference, your request is replicated below together with the response.

- a) Police Scotland's income from overseas training activities (including training of delegations at Tulliallan) for each of the last 5 financial years, ie 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20, 2021-22
- b) This income as a percentage of Police Scotland's total income for each of the last 5 years.

In regards to both of your questions, please find the requested information in the table below.

I would however ask you to note that in relation to international training programmes, our International Development and Innovation Unit income is mainly either under contract or awarded via grant agreement and costs are recovered under Section 87 of the Police and Fire Reform (Scotland) Act 2012. This will include covering the cost of staff, trainers, administration, travel, accommodation etc. and any relevant costs to facilitate the programme.

Therefore although the money received is technically income, we have direct costs associated with this which net off and do not generate a material surplus.

To be clear this is not earned income obtained from delivering a service, it is an agreement to cover reasonable costs for delivering the training programme.

Finally, I would ask you to note that in 2020/21 we gave a credit note for a payment made in the previous financial year of £28,555 and in addition had some funding that was carried over to the following year due to the impact of COVID 19. When this is set against income from that year of £19,733, it gives a total income figure of a loss although in reality this is simply to balance the previous overpayment and carried over funding.
